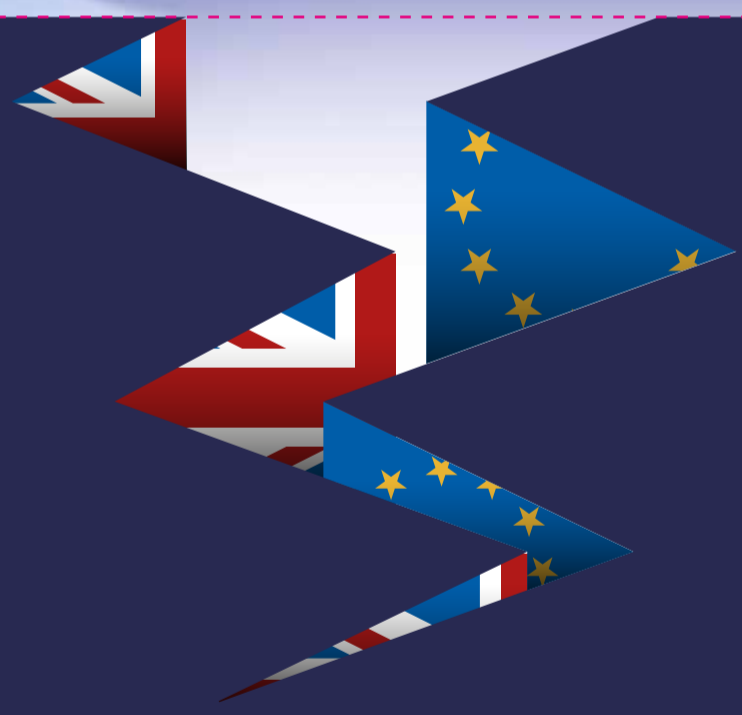

The microeconomic consequences of Brexit will assess the economic impact of Brexit for individuals across the UK.

28+ perspectives on Brexit: a guide to the negotiations will examine the approach to Brexit adopted by other member states and the EU.

Brexit and UK and EU immigration policy will examine the implications of Brexit for the free movement of workers within the EU and the resulting economic and political implications for the UK.
