

## INTERNSHIP SCHEME, UK IN A CHANGING EUROPE

Are you interested in UK-EU relations, UK politics and policy? Do you want to gain first-hand experience of working in a think tank? If so, apply to join the *UK in a Changing Europe* team as an intern! You will further your understanding of UK/EU relations and the developing impacts of Brexit, and broaden your knowledge of how a think tank like 'UKICE' operates.

### THE DETAIL

UKICE is looking for enthusiastic, self-motivated individuals who can join our team over the coming months as part of our internship programme. We will host up to eight paid internship opportunities over the course of the next year, each lasting a period of between a month and six weeks, working two days per week.

Whilst with us, you will work across the various UKICE teams - in communications, operations and events - giving you a real sense of the different areas of work that go into running a successful academic think tank. Those with an interest in research will also be offered the chance to work with our research team.

While our office is based in central London, we encourage all potential applicants to take advantage of this opportunity - virtual working meaning we can accommodate interns from further afield.

We are looking for individuals with good written and communication skills, who are organised, able to work to short deadlines and are happy to lend a hand as part of a small team.

All applicants will need to be over the age of eighteen.

### THE BACKGROUND

UK in a Changing Europe was set up in 2015 and seeks to provide authoritative independent research on UK/EU relations. Funded by the Economic and Research Council and hosted at Kings College London, the initiative has focused on the outcomes and practicalities of implementing the UK's decision to leave the EU and what that means for British politics.

The initiative's work is tailored to be easily accessible to policymakers, businesses, journalists, civil society organisations, educational institutions and the general public who are interested in the UK's relationship with the EU.

This work is overseen by Anand Menon, Professor of European Politics and Foreign Affairs at King's College London, as UKICE Director. The senior leadership team is comprised of deputy directors Paula SurrIDGE (Senior Lecturer at the University of Bristol's School of Sociology, Politics and International Studies) and Catherine Barnard (Professor in European Union Law and Employment Law at the University of Cambridge), as well as Senior Research Fellow Jill Rutter (previously Programme Director at the Institute for Government (IfG)).
